





## Why talk about bullying?

Every three years, the Minnesota Student Survey is conducted across all school districts in the state. The last survey was administered in 2019, and according to its data, 51 percent of Robbinsdale Area School's eighth, ninth and 10th graders reported being bullied. Reasons included physical appearance 29 percent, race, ethnicity or national origin 29 percent and weight 25 percent.
